



Several employees have recently reported finding GPS tracking devices on their personal vehicles at Anchorage International Airport in the employee parking. These incidents are being treated with the utmost seriousness and concern for your safety, privacy, and well-being.

What We Know

- The devices appear to have been discreetly placed on personal vehicles, not department-issued equipment.
- This behavior is unauthorized, illegal, and a direct violation of personal and professional boundaries.

If You Discover a Device

If you suspect or discover any type of tracking device on your vehicle:

- Do not remove it and do not tamper with it.
- Contact the 24-hour Airport Police and Fire Communication Center at 907-266-2411 immediately.
- Trained officers will respond, coordinate appropriate next steps, and work to preserve the device as potential evidence.

What We're Doing

- Airport Police and Fire are leading the investigation and will serve as your primary point of contact.
- Airport Police and Fire are offering vehicle sweeps for employees.
- Security and privacy protocols are under review to ensure stronger protection of our staff.
